### Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

The institution has a well-established mechanism for conducting both internal and external financial audits to ensure transparency, accountability, and accuracy in financial transactions. **Internal audits** are conducted quarterly by a designated internal audit committee comprising senior administrative staff and a certified internal auditor. This process includes the verification of receipts, payments, vouchers, payroll, and budgetary allocations. It helps in early detection and correction of discrepancies.

External audits are carried out annually by a government-approved Chartered Accountant appointed by the management or the parent body. These audits assess compliance with financial norms, accounting standards, and statutory obligations such as TDS, GST, and income tax. The audit covers all financial records including ledgers, bank statements, utilization of grants, and balance sheets. Any audit objections or remarks are recorded in the audit report. The institution initiates prompt action to resolve such issues through a structured process. The concerned departments are informed and given timelines to provide clarifications or make necessary corrections. Compliance reports are submitted to the auditor, and follow-up audits are done if needed to confirm resolution. This dual-audit system strengthens financial discipline and fosters stakeholder trust in the institution's financial governance.
