The audit covers all financial records including ledgers, bank statements, utilization of grants, and balance sheets. Any audit objections or remarks are recorded in the audit report. The institution initiates prompt action to resolve such issues through a structured process. The concerned departments are informed and given timelines to provide clarifications or make necessary corrections. Compliance reports are submitted to the auditor, and follow-up audits are done if needed to confirm resolution.
