

Guru Purnima Day Celebration at Smt. S. I. Patel Ipcowala College of Education, Petlad

Every year the college joyously commemorates **Guru Purnima**—also known as **Vyasa Purnima**—observed on the full moon of the Hindu month of Ashadha, typically falling in early July.
